Your information will be reviewed by panelists who will select the awardees based on the information provided here, the work samples, and letters of support.

### Requirements

## **Application Form**

The mentor artist should fill out, sign, and date Part 1. The apprentice should fill out, sign, and date Part 2. Ideally, fill these out together to build a strong, cohesive application.

## **Support Materials**

Provide two letters of support for the mentor artist, and one for the apprentice (three in total). These should be from people who know you well, and who can provide information about your relationship to the tradition you practice and your role(s) in your artistic or cultural community.

#### **Work Samples**

Include 5-10 images, ~5 minutes of audio or video clips, or physical objects that exemplify the work of the mentor artist. Provide the same for the work of the apprentice.
